Financial Aid

Complete Any Outstanding Financial Aid Verification: Do you have any
outstanding issues with financial aid that need to be addressed? If so, take care of those
as soon as possible so yo <mark>u can access your fe</mark> deral aid to pay for school.
Complete Entrance Counseling for Federal Loans: This is mandatory to receive
federal loans. Failing to do so will leave you unable to use these loans for college.
Complete the counseling carefully; this is important information about debt you are
taking on.
Address Financial Gap by Requesting Additional Aid: Your college may have
additional aid available to assist you. Use SwiftStudent to complete a financial aid
appeal, then submit the documents to your college's financial aid office. You can access
the tool at https://formswift.com/swift-student.
□ Pay Deposits: Temple requires a \$200 enrollment and \$250 housing deposit. Be
sure to pay these as soon as possible.
Pay Tuition Bill: Pay special attention to when your tuition bill arrives. There will
likely be a fairly quick turnaround to submit your payment. To pay for your courses you
will need to have all your financial aid finalized and loan counseling completed.

Complete TOEFL Testing (if needed): Non-native speakers of english must
complete the TOEFL exam and score 70 or higher, 79 or higher for the Practical Nursing
program.
Sign up for Fly in 4: This is a tracking system to help ensure you graduate in four
years.
Complete New Student Orientation: Registration for sessions offered throughout
the summer is in TUportal. At Orientation, you will register for classes and meet
classmates.
Get Campus Ready
□ Purchase a Laptop and Supplies: A laptop, while expensive, is extremely
necessary for college classes. Regardless of the school you attend, it will be essential
for completing your work. There are some low cost options, like Chromebooks. You don'
need that MacBook pro unless you are in a program that specifically requires it. If you
are struggling financially, contact your college, they may have loaner laptops you can
borrow for a set period of time. Make sure to purchase whatever supplies you need for
your progra <mark>m and anything you need for your dorm if you're</mark> living on campus. Here's a

☐ COVID Vaccination: Temple requires all students to be fully vaccinated prior to
arriving to campus, unless exempted by medical or religious reasons. For details and

☐ Get a Meningitis Shot (if living on campus): All colleges in Pennsylvania require
this by state law.

Purchase Textbooks: Do this as soon as you're signed up for classes. Check
your campus bookstore website for the list of books you will need for each course. DO
NOT purchase your books from your college bookstore if you can avoid it. Consider the
following cheaper options:
Rentals: Great if you need them for a general education course not in your
field of interest. Bookscouter.com allows you to see the cheapest rentals across
all the largest textbook websites. Just make sure you return your books in time
and in good condition, you don't want to get charged extra for them.
Purchase Used: Use Bookscouter.com to find the cheapest textbooks available. Simply put in your ISBN gade and it will show the prices for that
available. Simply put in your ISBN code and it will show the prices for that
textbook across all the largest used textbook websites, so you can quickly

compare and save money. You can then use Bookscouter again at the end of the

semester to sell those same books back to those same companies.

officer if you need help filling out your forms or have any questions about your aid

□ Housing/Residential Life: If you need help with a housing or dormitory situation,
check out this office. This is also important if you have roommate issues or something in

you have research papers to write, but it also has a ton of technology at your disposal
(computers, printers, scanners, copiers, etc!) The library also has a variety of spaces for

□ Mail Services: Every student receives a mailbox on campus so make sure you
